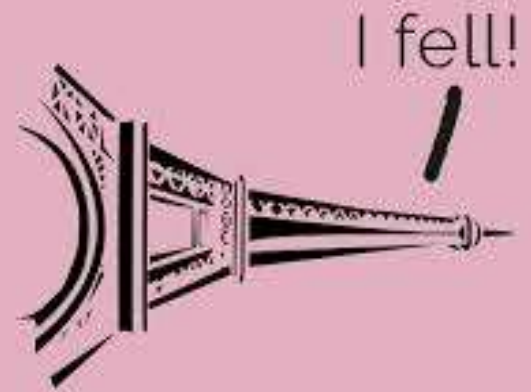

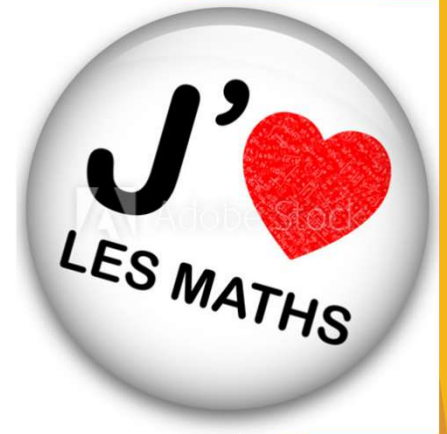

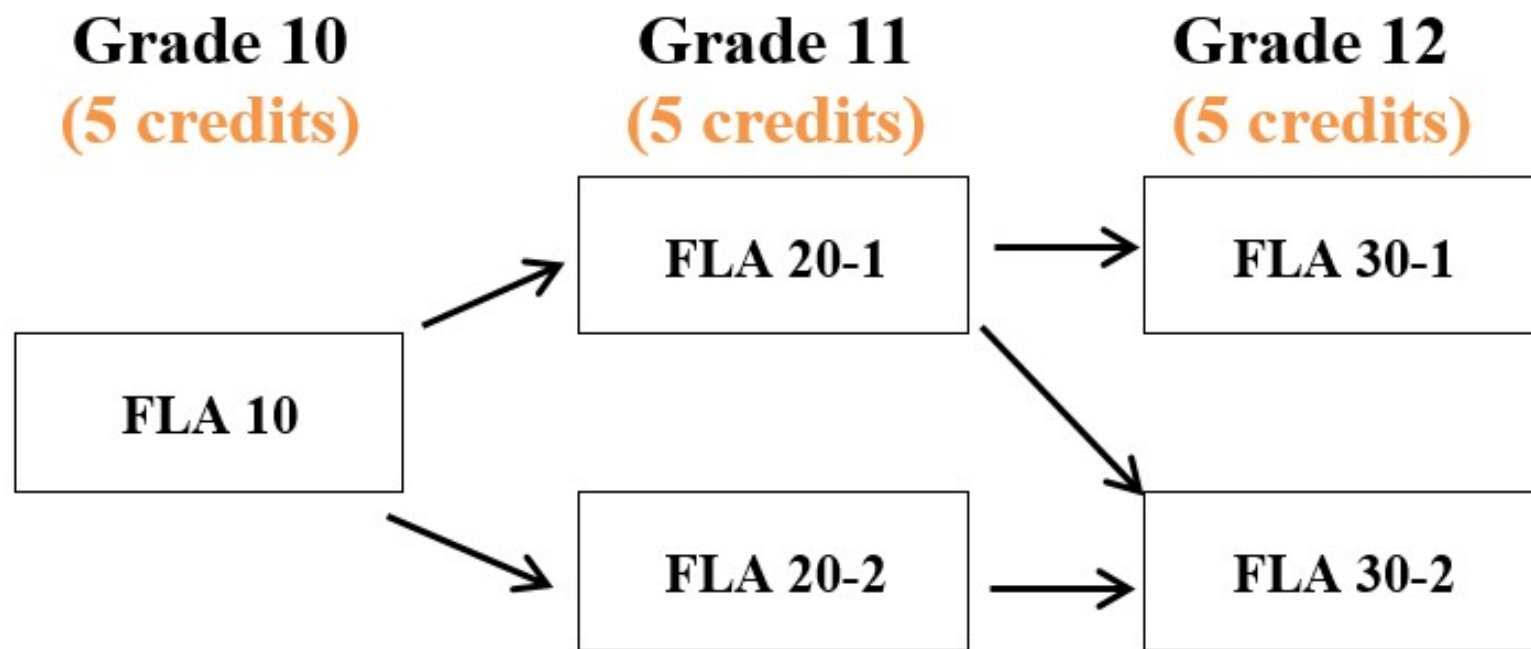
French Immersion Program

- If you choose to leave our French Immersion program, you will be asked to follow the withdrawal process and may be directed to your designated English program school for the next school year.

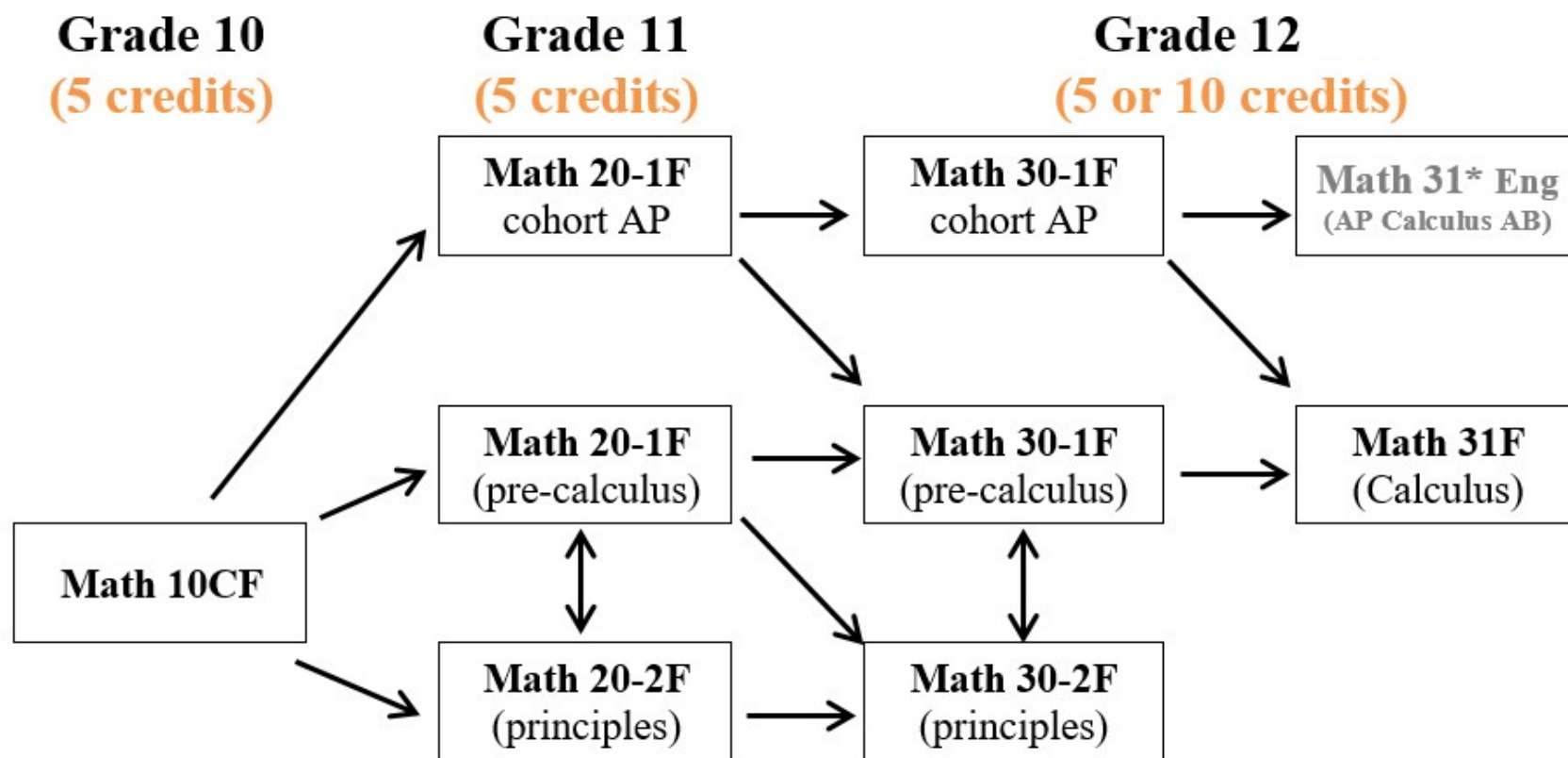

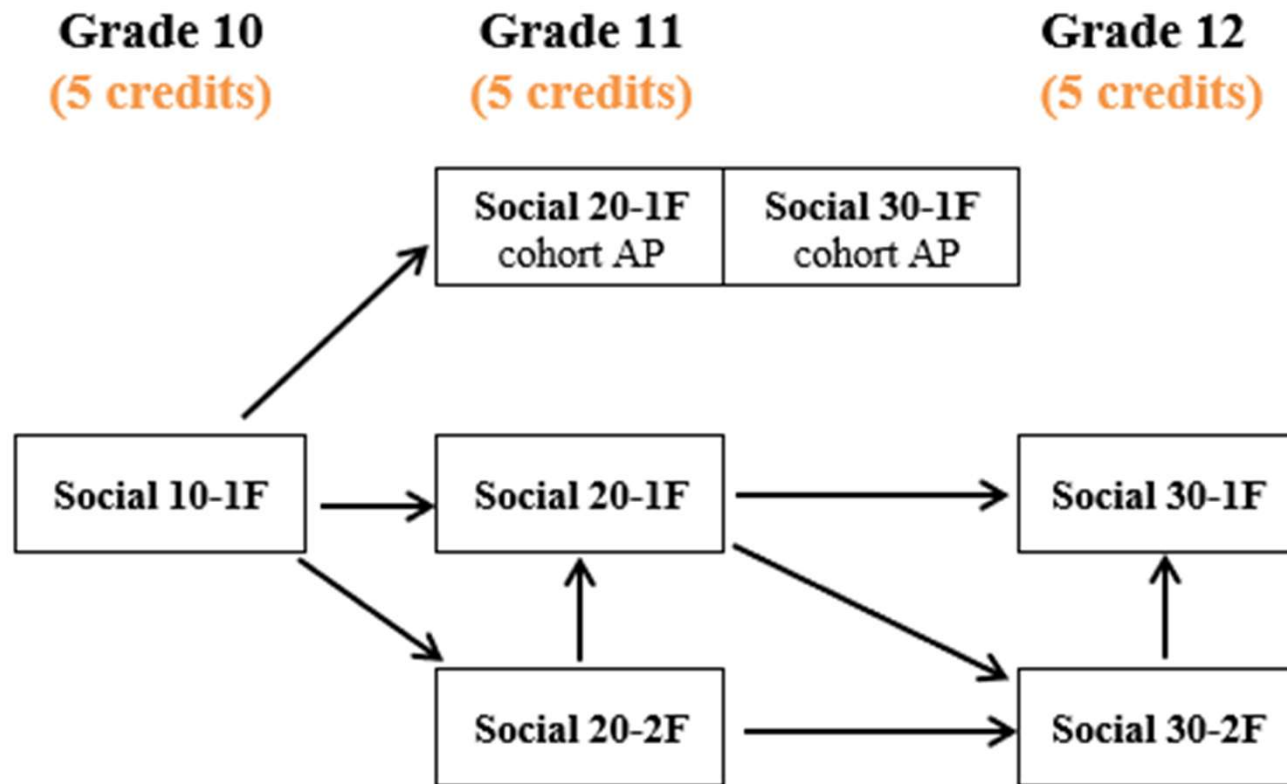

CBE - French Immersion Certificate of Achievement



- Students **must take all 3 subjects** (French Language Arts, French Mathematics and French Social Studies) throughout their 3 years of high school **(45 or 50 credits)**
- A **Certificate with Distinction** is awarded to students who achieve an average of **80%** or more in all their French Immersion Courses.
- If a student does not complete all 45 credits in French Immersion, an official school “**Letter of Achievement in French Immersion**” may be given to the student indicating the number of credits obtained.

- Look up new words (have a French/English dictionary on hand and a Bescherelle for verbs)

Early French Immersion Program (K-12) at the CBE

The Early French Immersion Program provides students with the opportunity to acquire fluency in speaking, reading, writing, listening and communicating in French by the end of Grade 12. It is a program in which French is the language of instruction, beginning in Kindergarten or Grade 1 and continuing to Grade 3 when English is introduced. Early French Immersion is designed for non-Francophones and is an effective way for students to become functionally fluent in French while achieving all of the learning outcomes of the regular programs of study.

First developed in Canada in 1965, the French Immersion program is based on decades of research into its effectiveness both in teaching an additional language and in achieving the outcomes of the provincial education curriculum.
